Keynote Speaker - Sylvia Trent-Adams



Sylvia Trent-Adams, PhD, RN, FAAN, FNAP, current president of the University of North Texas Health Science Center (HSC), started her career in 1987 as a nurse officer in the United States Army. In 1992, she transferred to the Commissioned Corps of the United States Public Health Service (USPHS) and subsequently retired in 2020 after more than 33 years of combined service with the rank of Rear Admiral Upper Half.

Throughout her career, Dr. Trent-Adams has focused on improving access to care for poor and underserved communities. As both a clinician and administrator,

she has made a direct impact on building systems of care to improve public health for marginalized populations domestically and internationally. Prior to providing support on a variety of critical issues as deputy surgeon general, Dr. Trent-Adams was deputy associate administrator for the HIV/AIDS Bureau, Health Resources and Services Administration. Through this role, she helped manage the \$2.3 billion-Ryan White program, which funds medical care, treatment, referrals and support services for uninsured and underserved people living with HIV disease as well as training for healthcare professionals.

Dr. Trent-Adams has been elected as a fellow in several organizations, including the American Academy of Nursing (2014), National Academy of Medicine (2018) and the National Academies of Practice (2018). She was also awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for her leadership during the Commissioned Corps response to the ebola outbreak in West Africa and the Surgeon General's Medallion for service acting surgeon general from April 2017 to September 2017.

In 2020, she was awarded the USPHS Distinguished Service Medal for sustained leadership, dedication and service at the highest levels of public health as the Deputy Surgeon General and the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Health from October 2015 through September 2020.

K. Wayne Yang, PhD

Provost, John Muir College, UC San Diego



K. Wayne Yang serves as the provost of Muir College and is a professor in ethnic studies at UC San Diego. His work transcends the boundary between scholarship and community, as demonstrated by his involvement in urban education and community organizing.

Prior to his academic career, he co-founded the Avenues Project, a non-profit organization focused on youth development. He also played a key role in establishing East Oakland Community High School, inspired by the Survival Programs of the Black Panther Party. Dr. Yang has engaged in community action-research at various levels, collaborating with youth, families, schools,

grassroots organizations, non-profits, school district administration, and labor unions. He contributed to the incubation of The Black Teacher Project, which started as a research study exploring the connections between health, career choices, and sustainability and eventually became a non-profit organization supporting Black teachers.

Dr. Yang's writings revolve around decolonization and everyday epic organizing. He frequently collaborates with Eve Tuck and occasionally writes under the pseudonym la paperson. Together, Drs. Tuck and Yang authored "Decolonization is not a metaphor" and serve as editors for the book series "Indigenous and Decolonizing Studies in Education." La paperson's notable work includes the book "A Third University is Possible."

Currently, Dr. Yang and Eve Tuck are leading the Land Relationships Super Collective, collaborating with Indigenous, Black, and people of color-led community organizations engaged in land-based projects. He co-founded the Indigenous Futures Institute and Black Like Water at UC San Diego.

An accomplished educator, Dr. Yang received the UC San Diego Academic Senate Distinguished Teaching Award.

Nick Macchione, MS, MPH, FACHE

Director, San Diego County Health and Human Services Agency



Nick Macchione has served since 2008 as director of the county of San Diego Health & Human Services Agency (HHSA). He has more than 30 years of clinical and executive experience leading and managing large, complex service health and human service delivery systems in various settings in the New York metropolitan area and county of San Diego.

In 1997 he moved from his position as executive director of a health planning organization in New Jersey to San Diego county government. After serving 10 years as a deputy director for HHSA, he was named agency director. Today, he leads an agency that annually supports 1.3 million of the

county's 3.3 million people with health, housing and human services through a workforce of more than 8,000 employees, 350 contracted organizations, 168 citizen advisory boards and a \$3.0 billion annual budget.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic in May 2020, Macchione stepped away from day-to-day agency operations to build from the ground up a public-private partnership and multi-sector collaborative effort charged with protecting the public's health against COVID-19. As director of the county's COVID-19 T3 Strategy of Test, Trace and Treat, his efforts included leading the rollout of equity-based, region-wide public COVID-19 vaccinations.

Macchione holds dual master's degrees from Columbia University and New York University and a professional certification from Harvard University specializing in executive leadership, management and health policy. He is board-certified in healthcare management and holds two national fellowships in community health and public health leadership. Included among his numerous awards and recognitions is the Malcolm Baldrige Foundation's 2018 Harry Hertz Leadership Award Recipient. As the John Hanlon Executive Scholar, Macchione teaches and mentors graduate students specializing in health services management and policy at the San Diego State University School of Public Health.


